Dr. Eli Avisar has over 33 years of experience in the medical field, and specializes in cancer surgery with a focus on breast cancer. He is also certified in breast ultrasound. He has been a pioneer in oncoplastic techniques and lymphedema prevention and is well known worldwide for his innovative S-LYMPHA procedure.

Dr. Avisar graduated from Hadassah Medical School of the Hebrew University in

Jerusalem in 1990. He then continued on to a general surgery residency at Shaare

Zedek Medical Center in Jerusalem followed by Mount Sinai- Beth Israel Medical Center

in NYC. Dr. Avisar is also fellowship trained in Surgical Oncology from the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center.

Dr. Avisar is currently a general surgeon/surgical oncologist in Miami, FL and is affiliated with multiple hospitals in the area, including Jackson Health System, University of Miami Hospital, and University of Miami Hospital and Clinics.

Dr. Robert Sidlow is an experienced, board-certified internal medicine specialist and is also certified in cancer genomic risk assessment. He currently serves as the Chief of General Internal Medicine at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center and focuses on four clinical areas: perioperative consultative medicine, managing the medical complications of cancer treatment; diagnostic evaluations of patients with suspicion of cancer; and the evaluation and management of men with inherited genomic risks such as BRCA mutations. Dr. Sidlow attended Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons and did his residency at the Mount Sinai Hospital in NYC.

Dr. Sidlow is committed to compassionate, patient-centered medicine which has helped him develop an approach to care that emphasizes open communication and evidence-based clinical reasoning. His passion for teaching has translated into receiving many teaching awards. He has served in a variety of leadership roles including Head of the Division of Survivorship and Supportive Care at MSK and Deputy Chief Medical Officer and Vice Chairman of Medicine at Jacobi Medical Center/Albert Einstein College of Medicine. Dr. Sidlow has academic interests in cancer survivorship, cancer genetic

risk, quality improvement, patient safety, clinical decision-making, and medical education.
