Moishe House is the world's largest peer-led program for post-college-age Jews. Through communal events such as Teal and Pink Shabbat® dinners, challah bakes, Superbowl parties, or whatever programs the Moishe House chooses, Moishe House and Sharsheret work together to inspire young adults to champion the importance of knowing about their cancer risk.

Moishe Houses worldwide are now equipped with Sharsheret toolkits, enhancing their ability to lead Pink Shabbats and other impactful programs. These initiatives are designed to foster discussions that raise awareness about Jewish genetic mutations related to breast cancer, ovarian cancer, and related cancers.
