

In this section you will find guidelines on how to put together a Sharsheret Local Program. Our Sharsheret team will work with you to develop the program that works best for your community.

Educate your community, honor survivors, and celebrate Shabbat together.

Plan a game or tournament in your community or with your private Mah Jongg group.

Incorporate a service project or awareness event into your b'nai mitzvah celebration, youth organization program, high school, or community program.

PINK OR TEAL CHALLAH OR BABKA BAKE

Overview

Gather your community for a baking event that blends tradition with purpose. Incorporate Sharsheret's educational resources and meaningful challah bake materials to spark important conversations about breast cancer and ovarian cancer.

Program Ideas

- Education
 - Invite a survivor from the community to share their cancer experience.
 - Have a Sharsheret representative speak about how the organization supports and educates people.
 - Invite a local expert to educate the community.
 - Distribute Sharsheret educational resources.
- Prayer and Optional Fundraising
 - Honor survivors and/or caregivers by "taking challah" and making a blessing for healing and support or say *Tehillim* (Psalms).
 - Arrange a way for members to donate their challahs to a local food bank or sell their challahs for a fundraiser.

Theme

- Prepare dough ahead of time to braid at the event, or during a longer event, participants can make the dough.
- Use beet juice or dried beet powder to naturally dye the dough pink.
- Have pink or teal sprinkles for people to decorate their loafs.
 - Remember, pink represents breast cancer and teal represents ovarian cancer.
- Encourage people to wear pink or teal attire.

SHARSHERET TEAL AND PINK SHABBAT®

Overview

Sharsheret Teal and Pink Shabbat® raises ovarian cancer and breast cancer awareness and provides screening education and healing to hundreds of synagogues across the country annually. An awareness Shabbat reaches a large audience of all genders and can be easily incorporated into your Shabbat calendar.

Program Ideas

- Education
 - Invite a cancer survivor from your own community to share their story.
 - Share a sermon during services with cancer screening education.
 - Bring a Sharsheret representative to speak.
 - Host a local expert who can educate the community.
 - Distribute Sharsheret educational resources.
- Prayer and Healing
 - Honor survivors and caregivers with an aliyah or prayer.
 - Incorporate a misheberach (prayer) for healing or the mourners' kaddish (memorial prayer).
- Theme
 - Offer a pink or teal-themed oneg/kiddush (collation), or havdalah (end of Sabbath) service.
 - Encourage people to wear pink or teal attire.
 - Add a pink or teal challah or babka bake.

HEALTHY LIVING WORKSHOP

Overview

Staying active, eating right, and lowering stress are all ways to reduce your risk of cancer. Programs focused on healthy living are a great way to attract attract attendees of all ages and interests, especially those who are looking for more experiential social activities.

Program Ideas

- Culinary Experience
 - Invite a dietitian or chef influencer as your expert.
 - Offer a cooking tutorial or demonstration.
 - Focus on essential foods to help reduce your cancer risk.
 - Suggest easy, healthy meals or healthy Jewish holiday alternatives.
 - Share how to cook with pantry staples.
 - Create a fun and healthy bake-off.
- Fitness Class
 - Invite an instructor or community member to lead yoga or Pilates.
 - Organize a spin or Zumba class in a local studio or community center.
 - Guide mindfulness exercises and meditation.
 - Lead a community-wide walk to raise awareness about Sharsheret and discuss measures participants can take to start living a healthy lifestyle.
- Team Sharsheret
 - Make your miles meaningful and participate in coveted races worldwide.
 - Plan a race of your own to promote healthy living and help Sharsheret support, educate, and empower others.

MAH JONGG

Overview

Host a Mah Jongg game or tournament as a way to raise awareness about breast cancer and ovarian cancer. Through your weekly game or community-wide event, empower and educate participants about Sharsheret.

Program Ideas

- Getting Started
 - Find a venue such as a home, or a communal location like a synagogue or party venue that can be used free of charge.
 - Check your community calendar and schedule a date and time for your event. Allow for 3-4 hours.
 - Consider an entry fee to lessen the cost of the event with additional proceeds supporting Sharsheret.
 - Ask a member of your Mah Jongg committee to teach those who need extra help.
 - Coordinate with Sharsheret to design a registration page where participants pay, donate, sign up to play either as individuals or with specific players.
- Make it Meaningful
 - Encourage attendees to wear teal and pink and decorate the space in teal and pink decorations.
 - Invite a cancer survivor or local expert to speak during the event.
 - Raffle off a Mah Jongg set as a prize.

Overview

Incorporate a meaningful service project or awareness event into your community program, celebration, or organizational initiative. Opportunities are designed to help practice *tikkun olam* (repairing the world) — giving back to your community, raising awareness, and taking action to help save and improve lives.

Program Ideas

- Assemble Care Packages
 - Organize a drive using Sharsheret's care package packing list and work with your local hospital to arrange drop-off for cancer patients.
- Host a Fundraiser
 - Ask friends and family to pledge to sponsor your athletic achievements.
 - Plan a bake sale or a crafts market.

INTERACTIVE PANEL PRESENTATION

Overview

Hosting a panel of experts is your best opportunity to provide detailed and life-saving healthcare information to your community. This type of program works well if you have a built-in audience that regularly attends educational programs. A panel of speakers can also be added to any of the programs in this toolkit.

Program Ideas

- Topics (See page 24 for more details)
 - Healing and Resilience After Cancer
 - What's Jewish about Breast Cancer and Ovarian Cancer?
 - Women's Health and Empowerment
 - Cancer Genetics: How do you Wear Your Genes?
 - Men's Health: Facts and Figures
 - Creating a Caring Community and Supporting Loved Ones Facing Cancer
 - Torah Study on pikuach nefesh (saving a life) or Other Jewish Values
 - Advances in Cancer Research

Panel Format

- We suggest no more than 3-4 speakers for a 45min-1hr program.
- Expert speakers will vary depending on your topic but could include:
 - Sharsheret professional
 - Genetic counselor
 - Oncologist, radiologist or surgeon
 - Rabbi
 - OBGYN, urologist or gastroenterologist
 - Mental health professional
 - Dietitian
 - Book Author
- Always include a cancer survivor speaker on the panel to help ground your topic in lived experience. We can help you find and train someone.
- Pro Tip: Invite experts from your own community. Local heroes drive better attendance.





INTERACTIVE PANEL PRESENTATION

Mastering the Q & A


- Invite a community leader, local celebrity, or Sharsheret representative to moderate.
- Sharsheret will work with you to tailor questions for your panel and prepare your speakers.
- Leave at least 10-15 minutes for Q & A.
- Encourage participants to ask questions that are more general (not about their specific health concerns.)

PRE-PROGRAM CHECKLIST

Use the checklist below as a guide to help plan your program.

Pick a date and time.
Book a venue.
Create marketing materials using Sharsheret graphics and Canva templates, or design your own.
Create a registration page or have Sharsheret make it for you.
Order Sharsheret educational materials.
Book expert speakers and/or invite a survivor to share their story
Map out a timeline for your program.
Order pink or teal decor.
Encourage participants to wear teal or pink.
Send out a reminder email to all registrants the night before.
Collect contact information from participants who have questions about genetics and screening or are looking for support and share their information with Sharsheret.
Send out Sharsheret's evaluation 6 months - 1 year after your event to measure impact.

Sharsheret team members are available to provide support for your program every step of the way.



EDUCATIONAL TOPICS TO INCORPORATE INTO YOUR EVENT

Overview

Below are the most common topics that can be presented by a Sharsheret professional, local expert, or volunteer trained by Sharsheret. They can be paired with one of the interactive programs outlined in this handbook and can be tailored to fit the health concerns of the broader community (beyond breast cancer or ovarian cancer).

Topic Ideas

Healing and Resilience After Cancer

Members of our communities facing cancer or other illnesses face difficult challenges. Create a program that brings medical, mental health, or rabbinic insight into the healing journey and offer spiritual and tangible support to community members in need of healing.

What's Jewish about Breast Cancer and Ovarian Cancer?

Explore why these cancers are Jewish issues, highlight life-saving cancer genetics information, and teach how to provide culturally meaningful support.

Cancer Genetics: How do you Wear Your Genes?

Learn how hereditary cancers impact all people in the Jewish community and what you can do to protect your family's health.

Women's Health and Empowerment

Create a supportive setting in which women can come together to discuss the many ways they can be proactive about personal and family health. This program can include discussions on screening, risk mitigation, body awareness, menopause, nutrition, etc.

Men's Health: Facts and Figures

Learn how hereditary cancers impact men, their families, and what you can do to take action to manage and mitigate personal and familial cancer risk.

Creating a Caring Community and Supporting Loved Ones Facing Cancer

Explore the ways in which individuals and communities can provide tangible support for someone facing illness. Learn practical tips and common roadblocks to care.

Torah Study on Pikuach Nefesh (Saving a Life) or Other Jewish Values

Delve deeper into the Jewish connection with the cancer experience and organize a text study with your learning group.

Advances in Cancer Research

Highlight the latest research and technology advances in the US and Israel. Speakers can include renowned scientists or even researchers within your own community.

If you have another topic in mind or would like a specialized presentation, please contact Sharsheret for a personalized presentation that meets your community needs.



ENGAGING TEENS AND COLLEGE STUDENTS

Overview

Sharsheret programming can be tailored to offer age-appropriate education and awareness for teens and college-aged young adults. Incorporate any of our program models in this toolkit to fit your youth group.

Tips for Programming

- Find out if any of the young adults have a personal relationship with cancer and include them in the planning.
- Assess the maturity of the group before determining content.
- Be clear with guest speakers about student maturity.
- Brainstorm with Sharsheret about what has worked for other groups.

Educational Topics to Include

My Second Backpack

Screen the Sharsheret film, My Second Backpack, and utilize the
accompanying discussion guide. Designed by Sharsheret, with guidance
from school psychologists, the film helps teens learn how they can support
their friends.

Changemakers

• Perfect for teens, this curriculum teaches kids about *bikkur cholim* and how they can make a difference for people facing cancer.

Have the Talk®

• Follow Sharsheret's talking points to teach young adults about how to talk with their parents about their family cancer history.

ENGAGING YOUNG PROFESSIONALS

Overview

Targeting young professionals provides opportunities to educate and empower individuals entering adulthood to take charge of their health. Sharsheret programming can be tailored to meet their needs.

Tips for Programming

- Determine if a young professional group already exists within your community.
- Find out if any of the members have a personal connection to cancer and include them in the planning.
- Brainstorm with Sharsheret about what has previously worked well for other organizations.





CONSIDERATIONS FOR MEN AND LGBTQ+ COMMUNITY MEMBERS

Overview

Sharsheret recognizes and embraces the full spectrum of diversity within the communities we serve. We recognize that breast cancer and ovarian cancer are often seen only as women's issues. The reality is they affect people across many gender identities. Men can develop breast cancer, and individuals across the gender spectrum—including transgender men, transgender women, and nonbinary people—can be diagnosed and/or at elevated risk due to genetic and biological factors.

Framing these cancers solely as women's health issues can lead to gaps in awareness, screening, and care. Recognizing that breast cancer and ovarian cancer impact people of all gender identities, it is essential to take into account *your community* and consider inclusive messaging that will ensure that all members at risk will be seen and heard.

Tips for Inclusive Programming:

- Use gender-inclusive language in all materials and outreach. E.g., replace "women facing breast cancer" with "people facing breast cancer."
- Audiences beyond sisterhoods and men's groups can participate in these programs - do your best to not limit invitations.
- Bring in voices that represent a diverse range of identities (i.e., women, men, nonbinary people, cis and trans, etc) in your planning, marketing, and programming as experts and as participants.
- Prepare all healthcare speakers in advance to address the cancer and genetic risks associated with men and LGBTQ+ people.
- Ask yourself whether the use of "pink" to represent breast cancer will dissuade your target populations from attending.

The LGBTQ+ community uses affirming terms to self-identify.

FINDING THE RIGHT SPEAKER FOR YOUR PROGRAM

Overview

Tips for inviting a speaker into your community

- Invite a community leader or local celebrity to help increase attendance.
- Identify talent within your organization first before looking outside of it.
- Be clear about how much time is available for each speaker.
- Ask to review remarks in advance.
- Provide any requests for remarks up front (e.g. gender inclusive language).

- Identify panelists and develop program content.


