SHARSHERET UPDATE: JULY 19, 2002

SYMPOSIUM ON BREAST CANCER AND FERTILITY

As the number of young breast cancer survivors increases, an important quality of life issue is becoming more salient: the ability to become a parent after cancer treatment. Many Sharsheret callers phone with questions about fertility preservation and with concerns about pregnancy post-treatment. To address some of these issues, Sharsheret will co-host its first **symposium on breast cancer and fertility at Cornell Medical Center** during Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Sharsheret volunteer Amy Mines Tadelis has been planning the symposium with volunteers at **Fertile Hope**, a non-profit organization addressing the issues of fertility and cancer. The symposium will educate patients and healthcare professionals about the effects of breast cancer treatment on fertility, available options for fertility preservation, pregnancy and reproductive options post-treatment, and the avenues of support available for those struggling with cancer and fertility. Renowned experts **Dr. Zev Rosenwaks** (Cornell Medical Center), **Dr. Kutluk Oktay** (Cornell Medical Center), and **Dr. Ruth Oratz** (NYU School of Medicine) will address the fertility concerns foremost on the minds of many young breast cancer patients. Representatives from American Infertility Association, Resolve, A T.I.M.E. (Torah Infertility Medium of Exchange), Fertile Hope, and Sharsheret will discuss the support available to young women addressing issues of fertility.

The symposium will take place on October 24, 2002, from 7:00 to 9:30 p.m. Invitations will be mailed out at the end of September.

Over 400 phone calls have been made to Sharsheret since publicity began seven months ago. Forty-five (45) of those calls have come from Jewish women seeking support or looking to support others. Many who called originally for assistance have become supporters (Sharsheret "Links"), adding to the chain of support that is strengthened continually by common experience.

PROJECTS

We have completed our second national mailing – an effort to reach **Bikur Cholim organizations** across the country. Sharsheret volunteer Beth Rosenbaum coordinated the efforts of many other volunteers who worked on this important project. Our first national mailing, to **Mikvaot and ritualariums**, reached women in Jewish communities nationwide.

Sharsheret has begun to distribute **Health Information Packets** at all Sharsheret events. The information packets include breast health guides, self-examination shower cards, and guidelines for the early detection of breast cancer.

We have begun to assemble a **Support Manual for Sharsheret Links**. The manual will include, among other things, guidelines for appropriate Sharsheret conversations, rules of confidentiality, and a list of resources to share with Sharsheret Callers. All Links will receive a copy of the manual when it is ready for distribution.

Sharsheret volunteers Peggy Cottrell and Amy Solnica have begun to assemble **research articles** on issues significant to young Jewish women fighting breast cancer. We plan to make these materials available to our Links and Callers.
