# NEW BREAST CANCER GENETICS STUDY RELEASED

In October, the journal *Science* published the results of the **New York Breast Cancer Study** on hereditary breast cancer. Since the publication of the study, men and women have called Sharsheret to discuss the increased genetic risk of developing breast cancer for Jewish women of Ashkenazi descent and issues surrounding BRCA1 and BRCA2 testing.
