SHARSHERET PRESENTS GENETICS SYMPOSIUM IN DENVER

Sharsheret presented the medical symposium, "Women at Risk: Genetic Susceptibility to Breast Cancer," at Rose Medical Center in Denver, Colorado on January 14, 2004.
