SHARSHERET AWARDED THREE PRESTIGIOUS GRANTS

Sharsheret is the recent recipient of a prestigious grant from **The Jewish Women's Foundation of New York** to support a symposium addressing the impact of breast cancer genetics on the Jewish woman and her family. The symposium is tentatively scheduled for October 2004 and a transcript will be made available on-line. Sharsheret was also awarded a grant from the **Wolfensohn Family Foundation** and the **Nash Family Foundation** to support a health care professional who will oversee Sharsheret's Link Program. A grant from **The Greater New York City Affiliate of the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation** will fund a culturally-sensitive education and support initiative targeting Hasidic and Orthodox Jewish women facing breast cancer in the New York area.
