WEBCAST OF SURVIVORSHIP SYMPOSIUM NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE

You can now access a free webcast of Sharsheret's recent symposium, "Surviving Young: Life After Breast Cancer," recorded at Weill Medical College of Cornell University on April 12, 2005. The webcast will be of interest to breast cancer patients, survivors, family members, and health care professionals.

The symposium addressed the concerns of young women who have completed treatment for breast cancer, including:

- How often should I be screened after surgery and treatment?
- What are the effects of surgery and treatment on fertility and intimacy?
- Where can I access information about proper nutrition and exercise post-treatment?
- How can I manage the anxiety I feel about the possibility of recurrence?

"Surviving Young: Life After Breast Cancer" was funded by a generous grant from UJA-Federation of New York, and was sponsored in part by Fertile Hope and Weill Medical College of Cornell University. This program was also presented in partnership with the Lance Armstrong Foundation, dedicated to providing the practical information and tools cancer survivors need to live strong.

SHARSHERET TO PRESENT AT SUSAN G. KOMEN BREAST CANCER FOUNDATION CONFERENCE

Sharsheret was selected to present the results of its recent outreach efforts targeting underserved Hasidic women at the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation's national conference in Washington, D.C. on June 6, 2005. With a generous grant from the Greater New York City Affiliate of the Komen Foundation in 2004, Sharsheret produced culturally sensitive resource materials and coordinated outreach events addressing breast health and breast cancer among Jewish women.
