SHARSHERET TO LAUNCH EMBRACE PROGRAM

Sharsheret will launch **Embrace**, a Quality of Life Program designed for young women living with advanced breast cancer. Embrace will address the specific concerns of women living with advanced breast cancer, including treatment options, quality of life, talking with family members and friends, and feelings of emotional isolation. Embrace will offer resource materials and individual counseling sessions by phone with Sharsheret's staff counselor, as well as telephone-based support groups connecting women with health care professionals and with each other. SHARSHERET TO PRESENT NATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON HORMONES AND BREAST CANCER

Sharsheret will present the Symposium "Hormones and Breast Cancer: Through Treatment and Beyond" at Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York City on Monday, November 7, 2005. The Symposium will also be accessible via webcast nationwide. The event will attract breast cancer patients, their families, and health care professionals to address concerns about the effects of hormones on women diagnosed with or at high risk of developing breast cancer.

Topics will include staying current on new hormonal treatments for breast cancer, managing the side effects of estrogen deprivation in breast cancer survivors, the impact of hormones during pregnancy on breast cancer, and the effect of nutrition and exercise on hormones in the body. Symposium panelists will include Dr. Ruth Oratz, an oncologist at New York University Medical Center, and Dr. Gila Leiter, a clinical professor at Mount Sinai School of Medicine and an OB/GYN at The Mount Sinai Hospital.
